

## Update from the President December 28, 2015

Dear Fellow Members of NIDCAP Federation International,

Our organization continues to be very busy as 2015 comes to an end. We have much to look forward to in the next year as we continue to build and nurture our relationships with one another and calmly grow stronger and more unified as an organization. Here are the highlights since my last update:

- In October the Newborn Intensive Care Nursery (NICN) at the Pediatric Clinic, University Hospital, Linköping, Sweden received NIDCAP Nursery Certification for their exemplary clinical practice. They demonstrate excellent NIDCAP care for infants, their families and the professionals and staff.
- The NFI has welcomed SONICU as our first corporate sponsor. SONICU's mission to create and protect a safe and healing newborn intensive care environment is clearly in synchrony with our vision for a global society in which all hospitalized newborns and their families receive NIDCAP care. Together we can enhance opportunities for educational programs for NICU professionals toward realizing the vision of both organizations.
- Our 26<sup>th</sup> Annual NIDCAP Trainers Meeting was held in Chandler, Arizona in October. We had seventy-three participants from fifteen countries, thirty of whom came from outside the United States. Of the seventy-three participants, sixty-five were members of the NFI. This year we opened up one of our days as a regional conference and had an additional fifty-six participants join us from the region.
- Please mark your calendars for the 27<sup>th</sup> Annual NIDCAP Trainers Meeting to be held October 22 – 25, 2017 in Bologna, Italy hosted by the Modena NIDCAP Training Center. - S The NFI Board of Directors met on Friday October 16 and 18, 2015 and the following actions were taken:
  - Renewal with small adjustments for market value of the NNACP Director and Financial Operations and Administration Director half time contractual positions
  - Creation of three small work groups on revenue, profile raising of NFI/NIDCAP and training and certification expansion in order to refine and further our strategic planning goals
  - Officer elections were held with gretchen Lawhon reelected as President, Jim Helm as Vice President for Administration, Deborah Buehler as Vice President for Organizational Advancement, Gloria McAnulty as Treasurer and Kaye Spence as Secretary with the agreement for enhanced communication.
- The Annual NFI Membership Meeting was held on October 17, 2015 in Chandler, Arizona, USA
  Mandy Daly, Jim Helm and gretchen Lawhon were unopposed and therefore re-elected by acclamation for three year terms on the Board of Directors
- In November our NFI founder, former President and current Chair of Program Committee Dr. Heidelise Als had the special pleasure and pride in announcing the establishment of the first German NIDCAP Center in Tubuingen with the festivities coinciding with World Prematurity Day, November 17, 2015.
- The NFI was active in promoting and celebrating World Prematurity Day in a variety of ways. Our Advancement Committee created a beautiful poster as a tribute to newborns, and to their families, nursery staffs and hospitals around the world that provide essential NIDCAP care. The Zakim bridge in Boston was lit in purple to honor the occasion. In Tubingen, Germany the opening of the NIDCAP Center was celebrated with the local church lit in purple that evening. - In sorrow we acknowledge and mourn the passing of our colleague Zack Boukydis, PhD, whom we value for his empathetic support of parents in the NICU.
- The NFI has endorsed the 29<sup>th</sup> Annual Gravens Conference on the Physical and Developmental Environment of the High Risk Infant, in support of our shared mission for early individualized developmental care for newborns and their families.
