Reflecting back on 2018... Our organization advanced our mission to promote *the advancement of the philosophy and science of NIDCAP care and assure the quality of NIDCAP education, training and certification for professionals and hospital systems.* We certified NIDCAP and APIB Professionals, Trainers, Senior Trainers and Master Trainers, as well as one new Training Center. We met together for a successful NIDCAP Trainers Meeting in Porto Portugal. We conducted beneficial NIDCAP scientific investigations. We implemented strategies to attract future hospital professionals to NIDCAP. We explored ideas around building partnerships with other groups who work with hospitalized infants and their families. Our organization will continue to strive to realize our vision for: *a global society in which all hospitalized newborns and their families receive care in the evidence-based NIDCAP model.* We will work to understand member perspectives and consider recommendations in how to best advance our

NIDCAP cause. We will work to address areas that are not clear or understood, including the NIDCAP Nursery Program, by developing new opportunities throughout the year for questions, education and training. We will continue to nurture our trainers and our training through the development of our trainer mentorship program with the hope to make it available for all trainers in the near future. We will continue to do what we do best - training and certifying NIDCAP and APIB Professionals and Trainers.
