
From decades of NIDCAP observations, general themes have emerged of best ways to support care. *Fatima Clemente, MD, Mandy Daly, ACII, DLDU and Dalia Silberstein, RN, PhD* led the effort to create a set of recommendations for support for parents with hospitalized infants.
